BASKETBALL GOAL SPECIFICATIONS

FOR PERMENANT BASKETBALL GOALS:

- 1) **Must be placed a minimum of 20' behind the front of the house**
- 2) **Pole must be black in color**
- 3) **Must be kept well maintained**
- 4) **May not be attached to garage**

FOR PORTABLE BASKETBALL GOALS:

- 1) **Interior weight must be used (nothing laying on top to weight it down)**
- 2) **Must be kept out of sight when not in use**
- 3) **Cannot be used in the street**

BASKETBALL GOAL SPECIFICATIONS

Basketball goals shall not be mounted on the garage or home, under any circumstances.

Permanent basketball goals must be mounted on black poles with backboards and nets being of a manufactured nature; no homemade or handmade goals are permitted.

Permanent basketball goals for detached garages must be placed a minimum of 20' behind the front of the house.

Basketball goals shall be mounted or located adjacent to the driveway, with the backboard and goal facing the driveway. Units are not permitted to face adjoining properties or the street.

For homes with attached garages and for portable basketball goals, the goals must be located a minimum of thirty feet from the street.

Portable goals are permitted to remain in an approved location as long as the goal is being used on a regular basis. Infrequent use will require that the portable goal be moved into the garage or stored in the backyard behind a fence.

Units, including backboard and net, must be kept in a neat manner, with nets replaced when they fray or break. No stickers, other than those from the manufacturer, are permitted on the unit.

Portable goals are not permitted to be temporarily moved into the street for play. This is an inappropriate use of county streets and presents a safety hazard to participants and drivers.

Units approved for use in backyards must be kept a minimum of ten feet away from any side or rear property fences.

Consideration to adjoining neighbors must be given when playing basketball. Balls shall not be permitted to damage neighbors' property and any confirmed and unresolved noise issues could result in a re-evaluation of the approval of the basketball goal.
